

Bachelor of Christian Studies

A three-year program (max 9yrs part-time) which aims to provide a general theological study to enable students to apply a Christian perspective to their personal and professional life. Each unit is one semester, a normal full-time load being 4 units/semester.

The course involves two years (64 cps) of theological study at Vose and one year (32 cps) of transfer credit from university study in a non-theological field.
